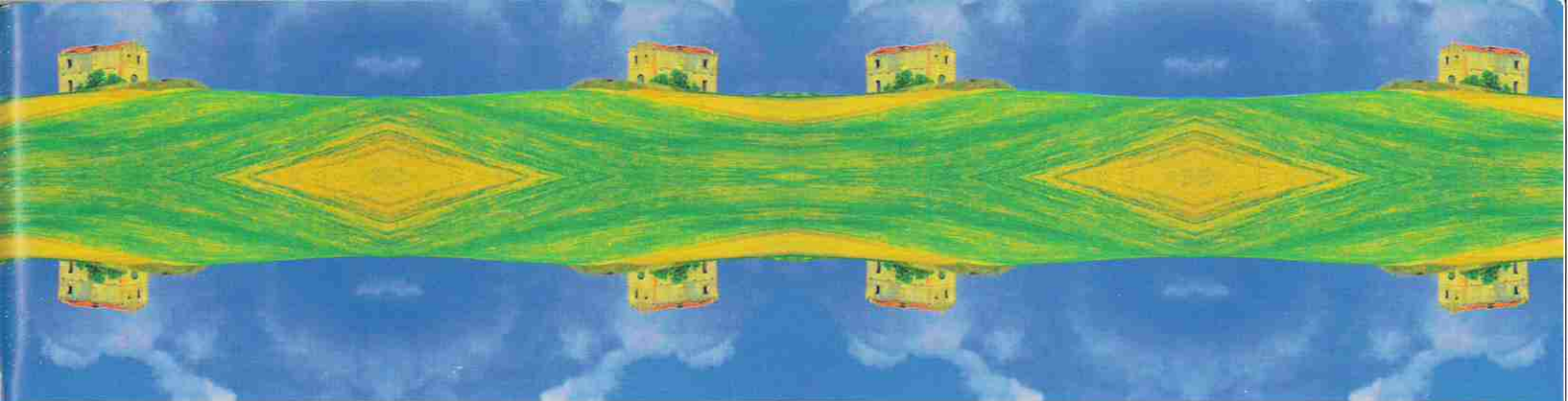

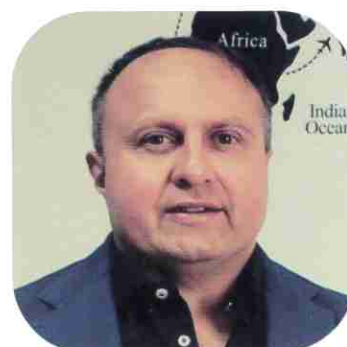

LAG START 2020

The LAG START2020 is composed by 67 partners, both public and tried.

The Start2020 Action Plan includes an extensive area of 15 Municipalities of the Province of Matera for a total population of 87566 inhabitants and an area of 1916 sq. Km.

The Local Action Group START2020 was funded in 2016 from the union of two LAGs, Cosvel and Bradanica. It consists of 34 partners, including public and private.

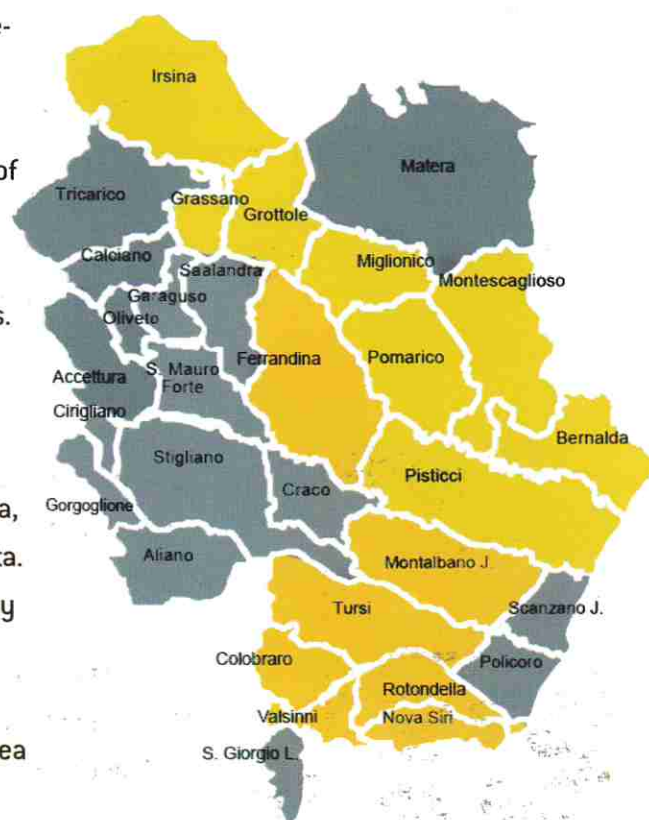
Its action extends over 15 Municipalities of the province of Matera for a total population of 87566 people spread over a total area of 1916 kmq.

The community-led local development strategy is aimed at pursuing the following objectives:

1. Development and **innovation** of local supply chains and production systems; 2. Sustainable tourism; 3. Enhancement of the **system of knowledge**, communication, enhancement, promotion and use of the agro-silvo-environmental, **historical and cultural heritage**, with particular attention to the principles expressed in the Milan Charter, serving the community as well as access to finance opportunities European.

The chosen thematic areas propose new opportunities for the territories involved that live in small/medium entrepreneurship, especially agricultural or directly related to the sector, rural hospitality, as well as natural products (new attention to the peculiarities of the places and the sense of beauty that they express) and enogastronomici, of products, more strictly tourism-cultural that recover and put at the center the identity meaning of the communities.

The territorial area affected by the local development strategy has the specificity of being a link between Matera, European Capital of Culture 2019, and the rest of Basilicata. In fact the specificity and relevance of this area is given by its being near the city of culture (Bradania), with a geographical continuity, up to the places near the sea (Metapontino) to get to the most important naturalistic area of the Region: the Pollino National Park (Basso Sinni).

The LAG Start2020's Action Plan

The LAG Start2020's strategy, in line with its aims emerged during the design phase, has resulted in specific measures to support businesses and the institutions of the LEADER area, mainly oriented towards:

1. encouraging cultural animation activities in local communities, supporting recovery interventions for the creation of places for cultural production;
2. supporting agricultural enterprises, encouraging investment aimed at reintroducing indigenous varieties, protection of PGI, ORGANIC AND DOC products and diversification in agriculture.
3. supporting small enterprises to ensure the provision of essential activities in local communities and creation of youth entrepreneurship (under 40 y.o.).
4. supporting sustainable tourism;

Besides, in order to strengthen the local development strategy, inter-territorial and transnational cooperation measures have been implemented to increase the effectiveness of the promoted investments and to encourage the exchange of good practices.

In these 4 years of programming, also considering the impact of Covid-19 in the implementation of the Local Development Strategy, the LAG Start2020 supported over 110 beneficiaries through 4 measures, helped the creation of 9 new enterprises (under 40 y.o.) and promoted over 16 cultural animation projects, one in each municipality of the LAG area

Within its own action plan, the GAL START 2020 has activated its project: Local Development Agency, to support a "strategy". Not only PAL, but also to support an evolutionary process of the GAL, and to connect other vocations and ambitions of the residential communities, thanks to the Leader. Furthermore, to create a new and necessary local professional figure.

We intend to raise the attention and inclination of social and economic actors to imagine a moving context, through the team selection of six local development agents, able to give off new energies and satisfy local opportunities' widespread expectations.

Besides this, we intend to assure a more "European" vision of the local development, through the exchange with other development agencies, both by leading the future agents to verify the methods and the function of development agencies, and by realizing an authentic scouting and support of the territory to supply development agency's services.

The Local Development Agents, included in the organization of the LINC, played a joint role between the Local Development Strategy and the European dimension, assured by over 300 participants in the LINC Congress 2023.

LOCATION OF LINC

BERNALDA

Bernalda is a hilltop town located in the province of Matera between two rivers, the Bradano and Basento. The plateau was originally settled by the Greeks, until the 15th century it was known as 'Camarda', reflecting the need of the inhabitants to live close to the lands they cultivated. It is believed the area was largely abandoned after the Angevin rule and repopulated in 1470 when the name Bernalda was derived from Bernardino de Bernardo, secretary of the King of Aragon, who restabilished the town. It was granted the title of 'City' in 1735 when Carlo III spent a night in the castle on his journey to his coronation in Palermo. The castle has four circular bastions and a square tower of Norman origin.

COLOBRARO

Built around the monastery of the Basilian monks of Santa Maria di Cironofrio, it was an ancient Basilian centre, which belonged to the Abbey of Santa Maria di Cersosimo.

The Castle, of which few ruins remain today, dates back to the 13th century and was the home of numerous feudal lords who have succeeded in the history of the town: from the Sanseverino to the Poderico, from the Pignatelli to the Carafa, up to the Donnaperna.

The small village owes its fame to past superstitions that defined it as the "land of bad luck", a name that the inhabitants have now been able to take advantage of with the organisation and staging of the successful summer event "Sogno di una notte a quel paese", which exorcises and plays in a self-ironic way on this unfortunate reputation by proposing, among other attractions, amulets and propitiatory rites.

FERRANDINA

Ferrandina rises near the Basento river, around which the gentle landscapes of the Matera hills open up, and is a true architectural masterpiece with narrow-faced white houses, one next to the other and piled one on top of the other. The village is an evocative intertwining of stairways and alleys dotted with numerous noble buildings. Leaving the historic center, the seventeenth-century church of the Madonna dei Mali, internally frescoed, is also worth a visit, before moving into the surrounding hills covered with lush olive groves. It is from these that the Majatica di Ferrandina extra virgin olive oil is produced, a very high quality product with a very delicate flavor, in addition to the very tasty dried table olives in the oven. It is among these scenarios, on a hill from which it dominates all around, that the fascinating ruins of the castle of Uggiano arise, an ancient



GRASSANO

Grassano is known as the village of cribs for being the birthplace of master Franco Artese, a well-known Lucanian crib artist who has exhibited his works all over the world. The artistic nativity scene of the master from Grassano is kept inside Palazzo Materi, one of the best preserved noble buildings in the village, seat of the municipality and a museum dedicated to the Materi family. It is a building that mixes baroque and neoclassical styles. Albeit for a few days, Carlo Levi lived in the village during his exile, and mentioned it in his Christ stopped at Eboli. Byzantine military fortification dating back to the 9th century.

GROTTOLE

Grottole is one of the oldest villages in the region, so named for its grotticelle, the grottos that are still used today to work clay, creating vases, jugs and other handicraft tools.

A little detached from the inhabited centre on the Motta hill stands the feudal castle, characterised by different environments, some still well preserved.

In the historic centre it is possible to admire the remains of the so-called Diruta church, never completely built, dedicated to Saints Luca and Giuliano. Not to be missed is the Mother Church of Santa Maria Maggiore, with the annexed former convent of the Dominican friars, the Church of Santa Maria la Grotta, rededicated to San Rocco, while on the top of the Altojanni plateau stands the Sanctuary of Sant'Antonio Abate, not far from the archaeological remains of a medieval city.



IRSINA

Named Montepeloso until 1895, the town has ancient origins, as evidenced by the numerous archaeological finds dating back to the Greek-Roman period, discovered along with an important rock settlement found at the entrance of the village. These findings were brought to light by Michele Janora, to whom the Archaeological Museum of the city is dedicated. The village was backdrop to bloody battles between the Saracens, Byzantines and Normans, and was elected bishop's seat in 1123. Within its turreted walls, the town offers noble palaces, portals and numerous examples of valuable sacred building. In the cathedral, started in the 13th century, the statue of St. Euphemia stands out among wonderful polychrome marbles. The statue of the saint protector of the city is attributed to Mantegna.

MIGLIONICO

Perched on top of a hill, the town of Miglionico is spread around the outstanding Castello del Malconsiglio. The castle, dating back to the 8th-9th century, is flanked by six towers and overlooks the entire Bradano valley. The castle's name derives from the bloodthirsty conspiracy made by the barons of the Kingdom of Naples against King Ferdinand I of Aragon (1485).

MONTESCAGLIOSO

A town of great interest for its history and landscape, Montescaglioso hosts the splendid 7th-century Abbey of San Michele Arcangelo, considered one of the most significant monuments in Basilicata. Spread across three floors, with the lower level consisting of rock-hewn cellars, the building rises around the cloister. On the upper floor, the Abbey is covered in frescoes, dating from the 16th to the 17th century, including the cycle of paintings that decorate the library, depicting saints, philosophers and allegorical figures attributed to Girolamo Todisco. Among the most popular events are la Notte dei Cucibocca (on the night of 5 January, mysterious characters return from Purgatory and invite children to behave), and the traditional Carnevalone, with its unmistakable paper dresses.

MONTALBANO

The town rises above the gullies, clayey formations that characterise the area with their particular morphology, making it unmistakable with a typical lunar landscape. Here in Montalbano there is the Regional Reserve of the Gullies, the largest in Basilicata and featuring geological rarities that make it unique in the world and of unrivalled scenic beauty. The Reserve also hosts many plant and animal species; in particular, different varieties of birds can be observed, so much so that the area is known throughout Europe as IBA Important Bird Area.

NOVA SIRI

Nova Siri is a 10 minute drive from Rotondella and is located just south west of Policoro along the border. It is a pretty hilltop town situated on the river in the surrounding area of San Nicola, with picturesque views of the Ionian coastline. Go there for the Marina di Nova Siri, a popular seaside resort with a stunning beach famous for its white sand and blue waters.

The promenade is lined by a pine forest which accommodates refreshment facilities and pathways.

PISTICCI

The territory of Pisticci is characterised in particular by the presence of gullies, clayey rocks formed by soil erosion, which give the landscape an evocative lunar aspect. In the historic centre of the town, built on the hills of Serra Cipolla, San Francesco and Monte Como, we find the Mother Church of Saints Pietro and Paolo, in Romanesque-Renaissance style built on a pre-existing church in the Dirupo district. Its large and tall hemispherical dome stands out and peeps out from every corner of the historic centre; precious are the altars and the Baroque style canvases preserved inside. The Abbey of Santa Maria del Casale most likely has very ancient origins, indeed it seems to have been built around 1087 by Rodolfo Maccabeo and Emma d'Altavilla on the ruins of an ancient Greek-Byzantine monastery.



POMARICO

The village, which was the birthplace of the mother of the musician and composer Antonio Vivaldi and today hosts an important music festival dedicated to him, stands on a very fertile territory rich in orchards, vineyards and olive groves. Its origins are certainly ancient, so much so that several archaeological finds from the Greek-Hellenistic age have been discovered in the surroundings. Several religious buildings, such as the Church of San Michele Arcangelo patron of the village, the Church of Sant'Antonio da Padova annexed to the ancient convent and the Church of San Rocco, all dating back to the Baroque period. Also noteworthy is the Palazzo Marchesale while, for nature lovers, an essential stop is the Manferrara wood, where it is possible to admire various species of flora and fauna, including the rare royal woodpecker.

ROTONDELLA

Rotondella is a pretty mountaintop village, located south west of Policoro. Its high position gives it unmissable views, looking over the Ionian coastline making it a great stopping point en route. Rotondella is an old Italian town with mentions of it in 1261 by the name Rotunda Marinis. It is also famous for its unusual layout, spiralling to the peak of the hilltop. The town is host to the Feast of St. Antonio Abate and the Fire Festival. This two day festival starts after the celebration of the Holy Mass, where a bonfire is lit in front of the Post Office while the bordering square hosts Albisinni music and folk songs.

TURSI

Home town of Albino Pierro, a Lucanian poet twice nominated for the Nobel Prize for literature, Tursi stands on a sandstone hill between the Agri and Sinni rivers. Pierro, in his verses in the Tursi dialect, has repeatedly praised its millennial beauty. To eternalise the poet's memory the Albino Pierro Literary Park was created, managed by the Study Centre named after him, from which you can enjoy an impressive view of the gullies. Inside the Park, in the Pierrian Poetry Museum a permanent exhibition of paintings by Lucanian artists such as Nino Tricarico and Antonio Masini is set up. They were inspired in these works by the poems of the illustrious poet from Tursi. Famous is the district of Rabatana, from rabat (which means fortified village). A little outside Tursi, about 11 km from the village, there is one of the most important artistic and religious place of Basilicata that should not be missed when visiting these places. It is the Sanctuary of Santa Maria di Anglona, a national monument since 1031..

VALSINNI

This village is situated in the valley of the river Sinni on the hilltop. It has the ruins of an Acropolis which can be seen arranged in staggered rows with a water source. It also has the Literary Park of Isabella Morra, a renowned poet. The park was established in 1993 and extends over the places that the poet loved: the castle, the old town, the Sinni river, Mount Coppolo, the Gallinico wood and the chapel of the Pietà. In these places and the town centre regular events, tours and exhibitions take place.

STUDY TOUR I. The Sacred and the Profane landscape through food and magic

Basilicata is often linked to magic, as told in the travel of Ernesto De Martino: an example is the Museum of Magic and Fantasy of Colobraro which hosts an itinerary where it is possible to learn about esoteric rituals and practices through workshops such as the one dedicated to organic herbs and their medicinal use. The study tour continues in Rotondella where it will be possible to visit the cultivations of Pera Signora, Slow Food Presidium (the pear has a delicate scent and texture and it is usually used for syrups, jams and dried). Moreover, you will make and taste your own handmade Pastizz, a baked product recognized as a Traditional and Regional Agri-food Product (PAT). Pastizz is traditionally cooked in a wood-burning oven. Its dimension is about 7 in long and about 4 in wide. Pork meat is the main ingredient, in addition to eggs and cheese, and seasoned with salt, diced parsley, pepper and extra virgin olive oil. You will continue the tour in a local winery by discovering the grape harvest techniques and the production of fine wines (Matera DO) such as Primitivo, Merlot, Pinot Noir and Chardonnay that find their natural habitat in these lands. In Tursi it will be possible to retrace the tracks of the Saracen presence, through a visit to the Rabatana, the oldest district of the city. Probably the origin of the toponym Rabatana was due to the intense Arab presence. In fact, it comes from the word ribat which in Arabic indicates a sort of fortress. For its important value, it has been nominated to the UNESCO World Heritage List.



STUDY TOUR 2 KMO flavors

This tour includes a visit to a farming factory in Irsina, where it will be possible to discover a native pig breed: the Lucanian PGI black Pig.

You will continue the tour in the Vignola organic farm, in Grassano, which produces organic and KMO products since 1995, and you will visit two wineries of Bernalda and Montalbano Jonico.

The itinerary ends on a "sweet note" with the figs of Miglionico (figs of the local tradition with digestive and nutritional properties known as the "dessert of the poor").



STUDY TOUR 3 From the land to the glass: our sustainable agriculture

This tour winds through the farms of our territory leading to the discovery of healthy products with an authentic taste and visiting educational farms that practice sustainable agriculture in Rotondella, Pisticci and Metaponto.

You will discover fantastic local wines (such as Matera DO) and craft beers in Montescaglioso with immersive experiences in our fertile countryside.



STUDY TOUR 4 Territory and literature

This tour moves along the places that marked the life of some of the most influential authors of Basilicata's literary scene. The tour starts from the Literary park dedicated to Isabella Morra, whose tragic fate will be represented through plays in the ancient town of Valsinni. The tour continues in Tursi to the literary park dedicated to Albino Pierro, one of the greatest poets of the Italian 20th century and Nobel prize nominee. The next stop is the Civic Museum in Pisticci where you will discover the history of the local community from the Neolithic to the present day.

The tour ends with an immersive experience in the Calanchi Park in Montalbano Jonico, a loamy rural area similar to the moonscape (Chiodo d'oro prize nominee in 2016 for its geological interest) where it's possible to live a fantastic experience discovering medicinal herbs and fossil along the way.



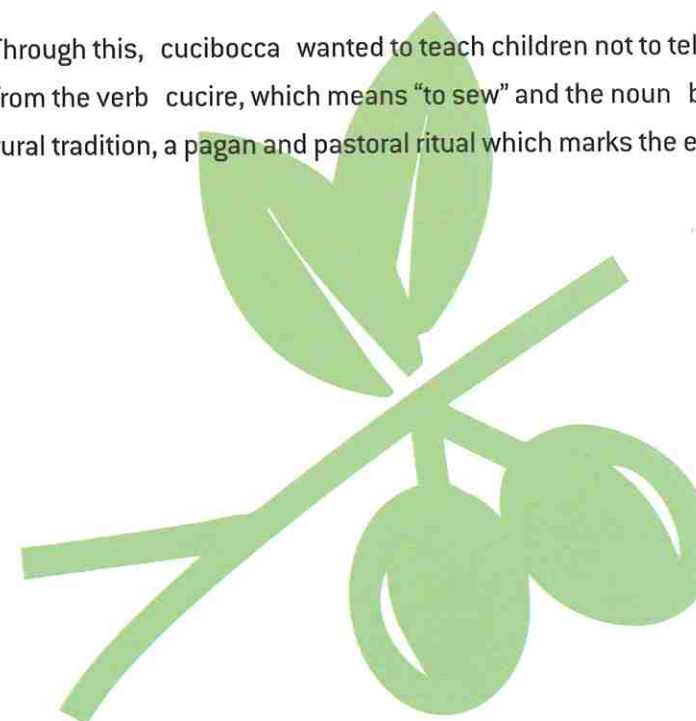
STUDY TOUR 5 The "Essenza" of Basilicata folklore and Slow Food

This study tour rediscovers farming traditions related to the production of olive oil in Ferrandina area, the land of oliva informata (a Majatica cultivar type of olive, baked and seasoned with salt and spices), Slow Food Presidium.

The "Essenza Lucano" Museum in Pisticci Scalo will be the second stop: an immersive itinerary, a multisensory journey among colors, fragrances and history of a bitter herbal liqueur, famous all over the world.

The visit of the Abbey of San Michele Arcangelo in Montescaglioso will be the last stop: it is the heart of cucibocca tradition, mysterious figures dressed in black, who sew the mouth to kids using a long needle.

Through this, cucibocca wanted to teach children not to tell lies. In Italian language, cucibocca derives from the verb cucire, which means "to sew" and the noun bocca, which means "mouth". This is a popular and rural tradition, a pagan and pastoral ritual which marks the end of the Christmas period.



STUDY TOUR 6

Trekking among nature, cuisine and history

This study tour includes an experience in the suggestive Calanchi Park in **Montalbano Jonico**, a rural and loamy area which reminds the moonscape (Chiodo d'oro prize nominee in 2016 for its geological interest) where it's possible to live a fantastic experience discovering medicinal herbs and fossil along the way.

You will continue the tour rediscovering farming traditions related to the production of olive oil in **Ferrandina** area, the land of *oliva infornata* (a Majatica cultivar type of olive, baked and seasoned with salt and spices), Slow Food Presidium.

The study tour moves in the cryptulae of **Grottole**: we call them *grotticelle* (little caves), prototypes of human communities realized in the prehistoric period.

The itinerary will be concluded in the Vignola organic farm, in **Grassano**, which has produced organic and KMO products since 1995.



STUDY TOUR 7

Journey in the rural culture from past to present

This journey begins with the Archeological park of the Rupestrian Churches and the Murgia Materana, characterized by soft rock consisting in deep grooves that make cliffs, caves, ravines used by men who settled there since prehistory. On the way it will be possible to admire Byzantine churches, the unique flora and fauna and the famous *iazzi*, old areas used as animal shelters.

The journey goes on with an experience in the charming Calanchi Park in **Montalbano Jonico**, a loamy rural area similar to the moonscape (Chiodo d'oro prize nominee in 2016 for its geological interest) where it's possible to live an fantastic experience discovering medicinal herbs and fossil along the way.

It continues with local wine and beer tasting between **Montescaglioso** and **Nova Siri** and it ends in **Pomarico**, with the visit to the Rural Culture and Folk Traditions Museum, enriched by workshops.

STUDY TOUR 8

Wonder tour: between charme and swarms

This itinerary starts in **Bernalda**, with the charming residences in **Borgo San Gaetano** continuing with the local wine tasting. It continues with the visit of the Abbey of San Michele Arcangelo in **Montescaglioso**, heart of the *cucibocca* tradition, mysterious figures dressed in black, who sew the mouth to kids using a long needle. Through this, *cucibocca* wanted to teach children not to tell lies. In Italian language, *cucibocca* derives from the verb *cucire*, which means "to sew" and the noun *bocca*, which means "mouth". This is a popular and rural tradition, a pagan and pastoral ritual which marks the end of the Christmas period. The itinerary then moves to **Grottole**, where the community cooperative **Wonder Grottole** created an initiative of urban renewal through the recovery of some disused houses. In addition, Airbnb rewarded the initiative of the integrated apiary "Wonder Bee & Bee" with a special mention. The last stop will be the "Essenza Lucano" Museum in **Pisticci Scalo** will be the second stop: an immersive itinerary, a multisensory journey among colors, fragrances and history of the **Amaro Lucano**, a herbal liquor, famous all over the world.

STUDY TOUR 9

An authentic journey across the flavors and the population of Basilicata

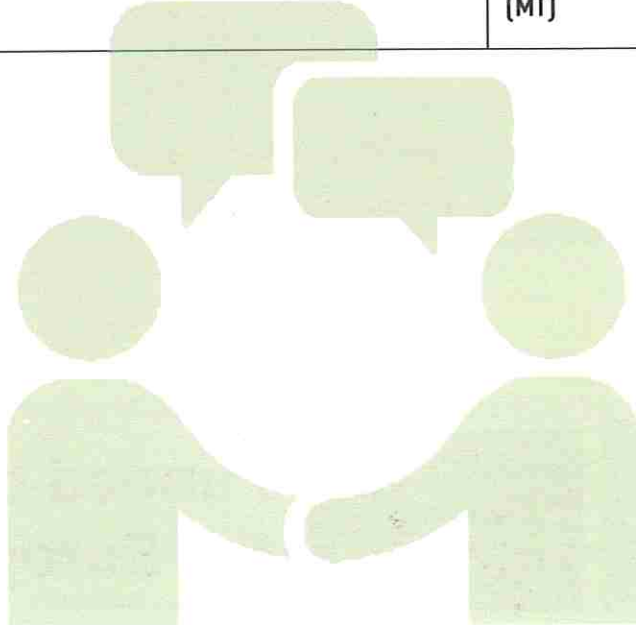
The itinerary ends with tasting of Matera DO wines in **Montalbano Jonico**, where you can live a unique culinary experience with cooking grannies.

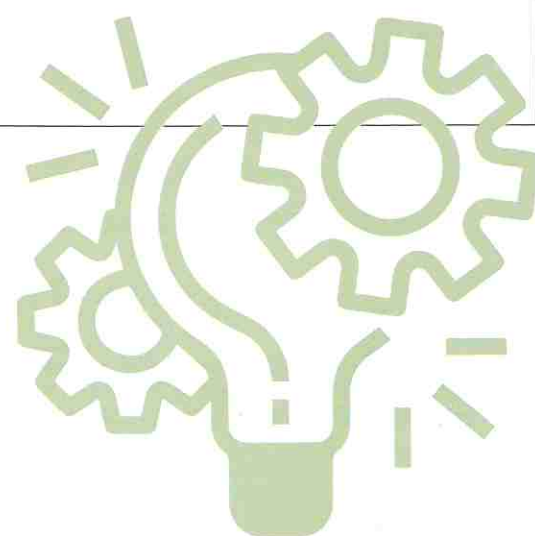

Short summary of the project idea*: The project "Slow Trips" was already in its infancy back in a first LEADER-phase during the years 2010-2013. The project, originally called "CultTrips", was intended to meet increasing demand for individual fulfilment through an **authentic experience, particularly in the fields of culture and tourism**. The planned project thus sought to develop a differing cultural tourism approach, as opposed to traditional cultural tourism, away from mainstream tourism and as part of regional development. Therefore the approach aimed to focus on the **participatory involvement of the local population**, with a **strong focus on sustainability**. The key was to create **good relationships between guests (tourists) and locals**, promote **intercultural learning** and **experience local traditions** through authentic activities. Furthermore a transnational exchange with other European rural regions was also aspired to. The **internationality of the project** meant all regions exchanged in a participative manner and supported each other by **monitoring and evaluating the tourism products of other regions**. Furthermore, the international aspect of the project supported the cultural exchange of all regions, meaning that after each meeting and Pilot trip, etc. people started to reflect on their own culture, tradition and lifestyle..

The project aims to investigate the female figure who went from being the angel of the domestic hearth, conquered sectors of activity where they had always been excluded, and who contributed to the reconstruction of both cities and civil society after each war. The project aims to focus on the role played by women during the wars, starting from the social context of the late 1800s, crossing the 2 world wars and pausing to analyze the female role of the that from the post World War II period to the present day. Figures to be investigated and deepened: Maria Plozner Mentil who became the symbol of the courage and self-sacrifice of Carnic women carriers. The "CAI women": after World War I many women participated in the inauguration of the Papa refuge in Pasubio, both middle-class and not: how come? At that time going to the mountains was also a new thing for men: there are photos of the inauguration with the presence of many women. Bonvecchio Maria, a nurse from the Red Cross in Trent, and the women nurses in general. Linda Malnati, Carlotta Clerici, Marianne Hainisch, suffragettes. Irena Sendler, Polish nurse who, during World War II, saved about 2,500 Jewish girls and boys Figures of military women (alpine) Partisan relay girls: Gisella Floreanini, Carla Capponi, Nilde Iotti, Clelia Corredini "Ordinary" women who, being the only ones left in the destroyed countries, took care of their material reconstruction, both the reconstruction of relationships and ties that war erases. Through the precious testimony of those who lived through the war, even the children of that time, we want to treasure and keep these attestations alive as a warning for future generations. Possible activities: an ecomuseum of the landscape that gives the possibility to experience the places of the Great War in the Vicenza area, with sections dedicated to augmented reality that simulate life in the trenches, the everyday life at the front, and with a section dedicated to the role of women in the Vicenza mountains.

rural tourism

Short summary of the project idea*: Our proposal for a further project would be related to increasing the level of awareness, responsibility, and appreciation about the cultural, aesthetic, and economic values of the local natural heritage. This would be possible by promoting the identified natural heritage elements in order to reconnect the local communities with their cultural values and for tourism purposes.

In this sense, LAG Lider Cluj was already a partner in a project among 4 other Romanian LAGs: LAG Dealurile Tarnavelor, LAG Tinutul Zimbrilor and LAG Prietenia Mures-Harghita.

During the project each LAG selected elements of natural heritage which led to creating routes in order to attract tourists to visit, routes which have GPS coordinates, 360 degrees photos, videos and each route has a story so that it would be attractive to the one visiting.

There was also a section called "Silvicultural Challenges" where tourists would receive a passport and had to collect stamps among the routes and take photos of the identified natural elements in order to win a prize.

What is more, for a development of the capacity to interpret the local natural resources, activities like training local guides and camps for children took place.

Our future planned project would be to take this type of project international, through a cooperation project with LAGs from the EU. Through common activities and developing new routes for tourists, by creating an alternative international passport on which they could collect stamps from different countries, activities which would attract them in the LAGs' territory. This would also help the local economy as we intend to also involve local actors which can be found among the existing routes (e.g. accommodation, restaurants, local shops).

Also, it would be helpful for the educational camps for children, as besides developing their capacity to interpret the local natural resources and learning important aspects regarding nature, they would also benefit of the social interaction between different cultures.
